Summary of consultation

- Ran 40 face to face small group sessions in Jindabyne
- Hosted 5 online sessions
- Held over 20 landowner and stakeholder meetings
- Conducting Aboriginal engagement via Murawin
- Promoted exhibition and activities via local print, radio, social media, media releases, posters, postcards

- 2155 submissions were received via the Planning Portal
- Majority of CAG members made a submission
- 3,392 visits to the webpage and 1,538 comments received on social pinpoint (interactive map)
- 727 responses to the online survey
